Technical Updates

- 1) Alberta Building Code 2014 is in effect and will be enforced starting November 1st, 2015. Key changes include provisions to allow the construction of wood-frame buildings up to 6 storeys, window installation to conform to CSA A440.4 "Window, Door, and Skylight Installation", and lateral bracing to resist earthquake and wind loads. (Click Here)
- 2) The CAN/CSA A277 standard was incorporated into the Quebec Construction Code Chapter I Building section in May of 2015. Enforcement in Quebec will begin on December 15th, 2016.
- 3) CSA B149.1-15 "Natural Gas & Propane Installation Code" is available for purchase. Stay tuned for upcoming newsletter for effective and enforcement dates for each province.
- 4) The effective and enforcement dates of the new Canadian Electrical Code (Part 1) 2015 (23rd Edition) varies province to province. Here is a summary:

Currently Enforced:

- British Columbia
- Manitoba
- Nova Scotia
- Northwest Territories

Pending:

- Alberta (Enforcement start January 1, 2016)
- Saskatchewan (Under review No effective and Enforcement dates yet)
- New Brunswick (Enforcement start January 1, 2016)

Ontario has its own Ontario Electrical Safety Code 2012 (OESC). It incorporates the Canadian Electrical Code 2012 with Ontario amendments. The ARC-Fault protection requirements in the Canadian Electrical Code 2015 are not required in the OESC.

Quebec has its own Electrical Safety Code 2010 incorporated into Chapter V of the Quebec Construction Code. It incorporates the Canadian Electrical Code 2009 with Quebec Amendments. The ARC-Fault protection requirements in the Canadian Electrical Code 2015 are not required in the Quebec Electrical Safety Code 2010.
